Provision is made for the payment of £100 by the defaulter to the injured party and the document is witnessed by James Hamiltone, mason; Thomas Mowbray; Alex Livingstone. servitor; David Fyfe, boxmaster; Andrew Reburn, gardner; James Hamilton, deacon, and James Stewart, notary public.
