Administrative/Biographical History:

Henry Wade (1876-1955), the eldest son of the Rev. George Wade, was born in Falkirk in 1876. He studied medicine at the University of Edinburgh from 1893 to 1898, when he graduated with honours. After active service in South Africa he was appointed as clinical tutor and assistant to Mr Caird (later Regius Professor Clinical Surgery), in the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh and the School of Medicine respectively. Although Sir Henry remained a general surgeon, he was particularly interested in the pathology of the genitourinary system and he later published his studies on the anatomy and pathology of the prostate and on prostatic obstruction of the renal tract.

Sir Henry joined the Field Ambulance Unit of the Scottish Horse Mounted Brigade in 1914. For this unit he designed a mobile surgical operating car, providing support to emergency operating theatres. In 1916 he was appointed Consultant Surgeon to the Egyptian Expeditionary Force. He returned to Edinburgh in 1919 and to his work at the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh and his private practice. He published many papers on urological surgery from this time until 1939 when he retired. He also helped instigate postgraduate teaching in clinical surgery.

He was knighted in 1946 and received many other honours from medical and other academic bodies.

In 1925 he bought the house and estate of Pilmuir in East Lothian and became interested in its history, compiling a volume of relevant material. The Pilmuir Trust benefits the College http://archive2.surgeonsnews.info/Content/content.aspx?ID=980

These papers, the bulk of which date from 1919, reflect these aspects of the life and work of Sir Henry Wade, in particular his flourishing private practice. Papers which include clinical material concerning his patients are closed for one hundred years.

GD14/6 Correspondence with surgical instrument makers

1919-22

This concerns routine correspondence about orders for new instruments, repairs, problems with instruments, etc. The supplying firms were situated in London, Leeds, Long Island City and Baltimore.

GD14/7 Correspondence_with office-bearers of the British Medical Association 1919-22

This comprises a few letters, mainly between Sir Henry and Dr G C Anderson, Deputy Medical Secretary of the BMA, on specific topics. Other letters concerning clinical meetings of the BMA and committee work are included. There is also a printed agenda for a meeting of the Edinburgh and Leith Division of the BMA, with a list of proposed office-bearers and committee.

GD14/8 Correspondence on financial and business matters

1919-23

This includes letters on Sir Henry's house insurance, personal investments, income tax and office equipment. Some of the letters from Messrs Russel & Aitken are signed by his brother, T Callander Wade, who was a partner of the firm.

GD14/9 Correspondence with the Superintendent of the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh 1919-20

This includes letters concerning Sir Henry's absence on study leave, the purity of supplies of anaesthetic ether and other administrative matters.

GD14/10 University Correspondence

1919-23

This comprises correspondence and memoranda on the teaching of students, both undergraduates and postgraduates, in clinical surgery at Leith Hospital, Sir Henry's acting as external examiner in Surgery at St. Andrew's University and other routine teaching matters.

GD14/11 Museum Correspondence

1919-20

This was written in Sir Henry's capacity as Conservator of the Museum of the. Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, an office he held from 1903 to 1920. They concern the administration of the Museum, including the presentation or accession of new specimens.

GD14/12 Testimonials

1919-22

These are copy testimonials written by Sir Henry in support of the candidature of his former students and former Army colleagues for professional posts.

GD14/13 Correspondence arising from the First World War

1919-20, 1954

This is a collection of letters loosely concerning military topics. It includes letters received by Sir Henry on the award to him of the C.M.G., arrangements for homecoming celebrations of troops, the formation of an association of former medical officers of the Egyptian Expeditionary Force, correspondence with the Army Medical War Museum, collections for a fund in memory of a colleague and arrangements for the presentation of a ceremonial mace to the American College of Surgeons from the Surgeons of the Army.

This includes correspondence about lectures to the Scottish Branch of the Red Cross in Edinburgh and other groups, the formation of the East of Scotland Overseas Medical Club, advice to medical colleagues on professional, non-clinical matters, arrangements to examine candidates for the Triple Qualification at the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons of Edinburgh, social engagements etc..
