Biographical History:

D. C. Dunlop, formerly a general practitioner at Worcester, died in Worcester on 13 April 1968, aged 63. David Cowan Dunlop was born in Ayrshire on 14 July 1904, graduated M.B., Ch.B. in 1926.

After early resident appointments at the Royal Infirmary and the Royal Hospital for Sick Children, Edinburgh, he joined a partnership in Rugby and remained there for five years, during which time he was also assistant surgeon to

the Hospital of St. Cross. He was honorary secretary of the Rugby Division of the British Medical Association from 1930 to 1935.

He took the FRCSEd in 1935, and in 1938 moved to a practice in Worcester.
