John James Charles (1845-1912): Physician; was born in Cookstown, County Tyrone, and was educated at Queen's College, Belfast, and abroad. In 1865 he graduated as Doctor of Medicine and for the next ten years was a lecturer in Anatomy in Queen's College, Belfast. He moved to Queen's College, Cork, where until 1907 he was Professor of Anatomy and Physiology.
